On Friday, July 30, 2021, attorneys and summer associates from our Jackson office were among those who volunteered at the Hinds County Family Law Clinic, a *pro se* legal clinic held at the Hinds County Chancery Courthouse. The clinic assisted individuals with a variety of legal matters, including irreconcilable differences divorces, uncontested guardianships, birth certificate corrections, and name changes.

The clinic was hosted by the Fifth Chancery District (Hinds County Chancery Court), the Capital Area Bar Association, the Mississippi Volunteer Lawyers Project, and Forman Watkins & Krutz LLP.
